Howard Browning RIP

Howard Browning, long time Pre-war and Feltham-era Aston Martin owner and AMOC member, passed away peacefully at home on 13th September 2025, aged 82. Howard had a lifelong passion for old cars having owned many over his lifetime, including Rileys (2x Kestrels and a Lincock) an MG TA and an AC Aceca Ruddspeed. His involvement with Aston Martin began in the 1990s, purchasing his 1957 DB2/4 Mk2 ULR 138 from his brother John, also a long standing AMOC stalwart for many years and one-time Concours Secretary. He soon added his beloved 1938 2 litre 15/98 CKW 338 to the garage and owned, maintained and enjoyed both for some 30 years. Together with his wife Marilyn and children Sarah and David, he attended many AMOC events and overseas tours, travelling as far as Prague (without a satnav) northern Spain (without a starter solenoid) and Ireland (without an exhaust). May he and his brother John be speeding down the country lanes of heaven together now. He will be much missed by Marilyn, his children, his 8 grandchildren and his many friends.

Between 5 - 7 September, the 21st International Concours d'Elegance Automobile - ASC-Classic-Gala took place in Schwetzingen Palace and Gardens in Southwest Germany, close to Heidelberg. A total of 205 cars were presented including 92 Pre-war cars. This year, one of the focuses was Aston Martin. Proud owners displayed 17 Astons in an impressing timeline, starting with a Mark II, followed by a 15/98, continuing with two DB 2/4 Mk I and a DB Mark III, a DB 4 Serie 1, a DB5, a DBS V8, a V8 Zagato (first owner Mr. Rowan Atkinson).

Fundadores Car Rally

Mark Shipman took part in the Fundadores Car Rally in Portugal between 26 and 28 September. A classic car event for pre-1939 vehicles and motorcycles, inspired by a historic run in Portugal over a century ago.
